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# RABBI'S COLUMN:

## PREPARATION for Passover.

### April 5,6--Kosher the Kitchen for Passover

As for chametz (food not to be eaten on Passover), you can lock up your chametz or “sell” it to a non-Jew. You can do it on-line on the Chabad website:

After Passover, buy it back and resume using it. And by the way, rice is now OK for Ashkenazic Jews during Passover. However, you might want to omit it at the seder.

The eight days of Passover are very special to our Jewish identity and we should mark them as different by observing as many requirements as we can no matter how minute they may seem to us.

### Tuesday, April 7--Searching for Chametz

On the night before Passover, one is obligated to clean out one's home and rid it of all leavened products such as bread.

Tuesday evening we do our final search for chametz. This search is a ritual search called, “b’dekat chametz” (searching for chametz). In Eastern Europe the tradition was to use a feather and conduct the search by candlelight (a flashlight is safer). If you have young children you can make it a game. The last chametz is burned on Wednesday morning.

We say blessings before and after the search.

Blessings before the search for chametz: *Baruch Atah, Adonai Eloheינו, Melech ha-olam, asher kid'sha-noo b' mitz-vo-tav vi'tzee-va-noo al bee-ur chametz.*

“Blessed are You, Lord our God, King of the universe, who sanctified us by commanding us to remove all the chametz.”

Blessing after the search: *Kol cha-mee-rah va-cha-mee-ah d'-i-ka vir-shoo-tee, d'-la cha-mee-tei oo'd'-la va-a-ri-tei oo-d'-la ya-da-na lei, liv-teel v'-leh-heh-vei hef-keir k-'af-ra d'-ar-a.*

“All chametz in my possession, which I have not seen and have not removed or of which I am unaware, is hereby nullified and ownerless as the dust of the earth.”

**First Seder**, Wednesday, 4/8

**Second Seder**, Thursday, 4/9 Begin the count of the 49-day **Omer** period

Passover ends 4/16

**Mimouna**

Remember that the end of Passover is a big Mimouna celebration among Moroccan Jews. Mimouna is celebrated on the night following the last day of Passover, which would be the evening of 4/16. I talked about Mimouna a few months ago. Even if we are not of Moroccan or Sephardic heritage, we can do something festive, beyond eating a bowl of pasta or a pizza because we can. Have a sweets party.

Moroccan Jews ate *Moufletot*, a kind of thin, doughy pancake often eaten with honey, syrup, nuts, and dried fruit. Because Mimouna is a celebration of spring, fertility, hope, and renewal, the food that is served is mostly sweet, light, and not very spicy. Maybe ginger snaps and orange juice would substitute if you are not up to making crepes--and yes, I know they are carbs!

### **COVID-19 considerations**

Here are some websites with interesting thoughts about Covid-19 during Passover. They deal with questions about finding Passover supplies, getting rid of chameitz at a time when we should be accumulating food reserves, the ethics of family gatherings, and on-line gathering experiences. The first article begins:

“The central question asked at a Passover seder is: What makes this night different from all other nights?

There is no question of what will make this year’s seder different.

The coronavirus designated as COVID-19 already has been referred to as an 11th plague added to the 10 that, as the story is told, God visited upon the Egyptians to persuade a recalcitrant pharaoh to release the Jewish people from their servitude.”
